## SAFETY

There is no access to the bottom of the gorge. The gorge is full of rare and sensitive plants and trees, some hundreds of years old. With no designated trail system at this time it is important to protect and preserve this area. HCA will be working with the City of Hamilton to link trail access to the gorge in the future.

The slopes and edges of the escarpment can be unstable and pose a fall hazard. If a user falls in an escarpment area, the only way to assist them out of the area is through a rope rescue by the Hamilton Fire Department, who are trained to carry out these rescues safely.

We ask that all visitors obey all safety signage and do not climb or otherwise bypass fencing, for their own safety and the environmental health of the area.
