Getting to and from Webster Falls, Tew Falls and Dundas Peak

There is **NO PARKING** available at Spencer Gorge (providing access to Webster Falls, Tew Falls and Dundas Peak) on weekends and holidays from April to October. Visit www.conservationhamilton.ca/shuttle for exact dates and more details.

- Tew Falls for access to Tew Falls and Dundas Peak (1.5 km walk)
- Greensville Optimist Park for access to Webster Falls

Shuttle service begins at 9:30 a.m. with the last shuttle returning to Christie Lake at 6:30 p.m., extended to 7:00 p.m. in June, July and August.

If you miss the last shuttle you will need to call a taxi or ride sharing service:

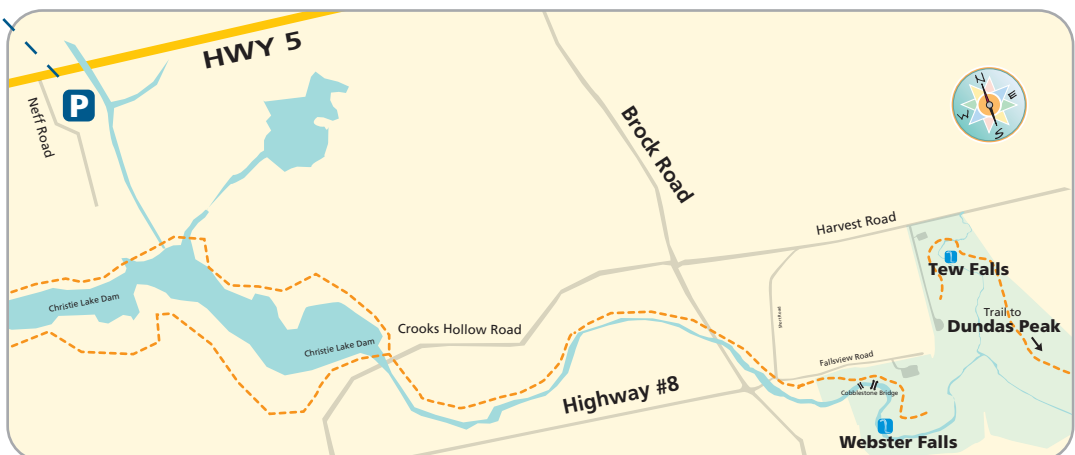

Parking lots at Spencer Gorge are closed during shuttle operations (rain or shine).

Pets are not permitted on the shuttle except for service animals. Hard-sided coolers and other large items are also not allowed.

Frequently Asked Questions:

How much does the shuttle cost?

The cost of the shuttle is included in the regular Christie Lake Conservation Area admission fee, \$10 per car plus \$5 per person. The admission fee gives you full access to the Conservation Area. Wristbands for the shuttle are issued at the shuttle hub area – follow the internal park signs to this area.

I want to visit Webster Falls, Tew Falls and Dundas Peak. Why do I have to park at Christie Lake Conservation Area?

Webster Falls, Tew Falls and Dundas Peak have become very popular attractions, especially during summer weekends and holiday Mondays. There is simply not enough room to accommodate parking onsite. Parking congestion has led to traffic and safety issues and illegally parked cars can prevent emergency vehicles from accessing waterfall areas. Parking lots at Spencer Gorge are closed on weekends and holiday Mondays from April to October, rain or shine. Visit www.conservationhamilton.ca/shuttle for exact dates.

Do I have to ride the shuttle?

Yes, you have to ride the shuttle if you want to visit Webster Falls, Tew Falls or Dundas Peak on weekends or holiday Mondays from April to October. Parking is not permitted on municipal roads in the area. The City of Hamilton enforces these parking rules. The fine for parking in a prohibited area is \$250. You can also hike to Webster Falls from Christie Lake Conservation Area on the local trail network, approximately 3.5 km one way.



What can I expect to see or do at Webster Falls, Tew Falls and Dundas Peak?

Hiking in the area takes you to numerous viewing platforms and viewpoints to see the waterfalls and Spencer Gorge. For your safety, it is important to stay on designated trails, remain back from edges and behind safety barriers. There is no access into the bottom of the gorge or below the waterfalls.

What is there to do at Christie Lake?

There are lots of amenities and activities to enjoy at Christie Lake Conservation Area, including:

- Full washroom facilities
- Picnic areas
- Swimming
- Fishing
- Hiking
- Boat rentals
- Beach store to purchase ice cream, snacks and drinks
- Single track mountain bike trails
