The Hamilton Watershed Stewardship Program has been working with private property owners in the watershed since 1994. providing advice on environmentally friendly ways of managing properties with natural features. such as woodlots. wetlands. meadows and creeks.

What can you expect from us?

Our professional and courteous Stewardship Technicians will meet with you on your property to discuss your concerns and objectives. You can take this opportunity to learn about:

- the plants and animals that share your land and the habitat they need;
- tax incentives and programs that may be available to help you;
- management issues related to plantations and natural forests;
- ecologically friendly pond management;
- well decommissioning;
- managing invasive species; and
- streamside enhancements to improve water quality and reduce erosion.

During the site visit our Stewardship Technicians will listen to concerns about the natural environment. The Stewardship Technician will make observations about the health of the natural features of your property and will suggest a variety of management techniques for your consideration that can enhance or improve the state of your property. Our Stewardship Technicians will follow up with a letter and information package to assist you in meeting your land management goals.

If you decide to undertake a restoration project on your property, your Stewardship Technician can draft a plan for the work to guide you through the process. Your Stewardship Technician will remain available to you by phone or in person if you have additional questions or new issues that you would like to discuss. They can also direct you to other natural resources management professionals that you may wish to contact.

Simple things you can do on your own!

- Help improve the water quality in local streams by creating a buffer along your creek. Just create a no mow zone along the creek and allow the area to regenerate naturally.
- Naturalize a portion of your lawn; reducing the amount of time you'll have to spend doing yard work while at the same time creating precious habitat.
