WESTFIELD HERITAGE VILLAGE CONSERVATION AREA

Enjoy almost 8 km of easy walking trails conveniently accessed from the Village area. The conservation area is approximately 204 hectares (503 acres) in size and features natural woodlands, plantation forests, and provincially significant wetlands, meadow area and many cultural heritage features.

Giant Swallowtail Trail: This 2 km trail, walking from the Village parking lot, is an easy walk that features plantation forest and wetlands. Originally this trail was the farm lane to the Smith family farm. Keep an eye out for the stone ruins of the old farm.

Chinquapin Oak Trail: This 3 km trail, walking from the Village parking lot, makes a nice circular loop from the Village. The trail is named for the Chinquapin Oak Tree, a Carolinian variety, that is uncommon in Canada.

The Tanager and Chinmaya Trails: This new trail system offers 2.4 km of trail option to your hike. It brings visitors through a Sugar Maple woodlot and features three bridges crossing wetlands and streams. The Scarlet Tanager is one of many migratory birds that visit Westfield. Look for a bright red bird with black wings.

- Do not deface, remove, disturb or damage any property, plants, birds or mammals in the conservation area.
- Westfield is partially accessible, please call for details.
- Pets must be on a leash at all times.
- Pet waste must be picked up and thrown away in the garbage.

WEDDINGS

Westfield is the ideal setting for weddings, offering one convenient location for a ceremony, photographs and reception.

The Ironwood Hall is a modern reception hall offering air conditioning, a full kitchen and is wheelchair accessible.

The Mountsberg Church is a charming Victorian church that offers hardwood floors, chandeliers and a piano. Heat and hydro available.

The Victorian Bandstand is a beautiful option for an outdoor ceremony.


