# **BOOKING INFORMATION**

Connect your class with the outdoors through year-round outdoor environmental education programs offered by the Hamilton Conservation Authority.

#### PROGRAM INFORMATION

- Programs are typically 2 hours in length, but we encourage groups to come for at least a 3 hour visit whenever possible. This allows time for bathroom and nutrition breaks.
- Program arrival and departure times can be adapted to suit your group's scheduling requirements.
- We can accommodate two classes per day with a maximum class size of 30 students.
- Programs are connected to the Ontario Science Curriculum.
- The majority of the program time is spent outdoors, weather depending.
- While we make every effort to accommodate students with special needs it is not always possible given our rugged terrain. Please let us know about all your students' needs at the time of your booking request so that we can discuss potential program options.
- Please ensure that all your students are dressed properly for an outdoor program, proper outdoor footwear like running shoes, hiking boots or other closed toed shoes is essential. Students that arrive without proper outdoor gear may not be permitted to participate in outdoor activities.
- Our staff are enthusiastic Naturalists who are excited to share their knowledge and appreciation for the natural world with you and your students.

## **INCLEMENT WEATHER**

- All programs continue rain or shine. Program participants are expected to dress appropriately for the weather and outside conditions.
- During inclement weather programs will be modified to have more of the program conducted indoors.
- In extreme weather school programs may need to be cancelled. Schools will be notified in advance to make alternative arrangements and re-schedule the date.

## SECONDARY PROGRAM GUIDE

## **Habitat Analysis**

Students will explore a local habitat, working in small groups to examine key physical characteristics of the site. They will also conduct a biodiversity survey, observing the wildlife and vegetation of the site. Groups will then use all of this information to evaluate the health of the habitat.

## **Human Impact Study**

Students will work in small groups to evaluate the impact of human activity on a local ecosystem by examining the biodiversity of an area and noting any human impacts they observe. They will also learn about invasive species, working as a team to determine whether or not different plants in the area are invasive by examining key characteristics.

## **Stream Study**

Student will evaluate the health of a local stream, using both biotic and abiotic factors to inform their assessment. They will collect Benthic Macro Invertebrates from shallow areas of the stream, then use a dichotomous key to identify species. They will also perform physical tests, such as water pH and temperature. All equipment, including rubber boots, will be provided.

Note: This program is only available in September, October, May and June. It is also only offered with limited availability to prevent negative environmental impact on the ecosystem.

#### **Bruce Trail Hike**

Students will hike a section of the Bruce Trail that winds through the Dundas Valley Conservation Area. This trail passes through shady forests and open meadows, showcasing lots of the diverse nature found in this area. This route has several hills and is an intermediate level hike.

#### **Eco Games**

Students will participate in an assortment of games and activities themed around our local ecology. These will be a combination of higher and lower energy games, played in our playing field or one of our forest areas.

### **Seasonal Exploration**

Students will spend some time exploring a nearby forest or meadow area. This program involves lots of hands-on opportunities for discovering what lives in the Dundas Valley, such as sweep netting during warmer weather or searching for signs of winter wildlife in the colder months.
